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or zipped?

A. My recollection is they were.

Q. OK. The belt was fastened?

A. That is correct.

Q. To your recollection?

A. Yes.

Q. OK. You said you found a gunshot wound to the left temple area. Could you show where that was just by pointing to the area on your body?

A. In this approximate area (indicates).

Q. Describe the area surrounding that wound.

A. I'd like to refer to the text on my protocol for that description.

The gunshot wound itself was rounded, the entrance gunshot wound was six millimeters in diameter and surrounding that there was a zone, a rounded zone of stippling of the skin and swelling and blueish discoloration or bruising.

Q. What is stippling?

A. Stippling is the presence of fine punctate indentation of the skin.

Q. What is that?

A. Such as might be produced by a needle.

Q. What causes that?

A. Stippling in relation to gunshot wounds of this kind is a result of burning of the skin by residues of gunpowder
